 Deed | This Indenture, made this twenty ninth
 the day of March in the year of our
 Lord One thousand Eight hundred and
 Seventy three Between M. C. Coleman and Mary Jane Cole-
 man his wife of the City of Chicago in the County of Cook
 and State of Illinois parties of the first part and Sarah C.
 Brown of the City of Chicago in the County of Cook and
 State of Illinois party of the second part. Witnesseth, that the
 said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the
 sum of Three thousand Dollars (\$3000) in hand paid by the
 said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged, and the said party of the second part forever
 release and discharged therefrom, has granted, bargained, sold,
 remised, released, conveyed, aliened, and confirmed, and by these
 presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, convey, alien,
 and confirm, unto the said party of the second part, and
 to her heirs and assigns forever, all the following described
 lot, piece, or parcel of land, situated in the County of
 Madison and State of Iowa, and known and described
 as follows, to-wit: East half (1/2) of South East quarter
 (1/4) of Section thirty (30) & North half (1/2) of the North East quarter (1/4)
 and the North half (1/2) of the South half (1/2) of North East quarter
 (1/4) of Section thirty one (31) all in Township Seventy five (75)
 North Range Twenty Eighth (28) West of Fifth Principal Meridian
 containing in all two hundred acres
 Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurten-
 ances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and
 the revision and revisions, remainders and remainders, rents, issues
 and profits thereof; and all the Estate, right, title, interest,
 claim, or demand whatsoever, of the said party of the first part
 either in law or equity, of in and to the above bargained prem-
 ises, with the hereditaments and appurtenances; to have and
 to hold the said premises ^{for} above described; with the appur-
 tenances, unto the said party of the second part her heirs and
 assigns, forever. And the said M. C. Coleman & Mary
 Jane Coleman his wife parties of the first part, their heirs, exe-
 cutors, and administrators, do covenant, grant, bargain,
 in, and agree, to and with the said party of the second
 part her heirs and assigns that at the time of the exe-

cliny and delivery of these presents, they were well seized of the premises above conveyed, as of a good, sure, perfect, absolute, and indefeasible estate of inheritance in law, in fee simple, and has good right, full power, and lawful authority to grant, bargain, sell, and convey the same in manner and form aforesaid, and that the same are free and clear from all former and other grants, bargain, sales, liens, taxes, assessments, and encumbrances, of what kind or nature soever; and the above bargained premises, in the quiet and peaceable possession of said party of the second part her heirs and assigns, against all and every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the whole or any part thereof, the said party of the first part shall and will warrant ^{forever} and defend except as to an incumbrance of six hundred Dollars in favor of J. C. Baldnell, and the said party of the first part hereby expressly waive and release any and all right, benefit, privilege, advantage, and exemption, under or by virtue of any and all Statutes of the State of Illinois, providing for the exemption of homesteads from sale on execution or otherwise.
