 Certificate greeting:
No. 7852 Whereas, Thomas J. Rhyno of Madison county,
 Iowa, has deposited in the General Land Office
 of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land
 Office at Chariton whereby it appears that full payment
 has been made by the said Thomas J. Rhyno according to
 the provisions of the act of Congress of the 2nd of April, 1820,
 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale
 of the public lands," for the South East quarter of the North
 West quarter of section Thirty Two in Township Seventy
 five, North of Range Twenty six west, in the District of
 Lands subject to sale at Chariton, Iowa, containing
 forty acres according to the official Plat of the survey of
 the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by
 the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purhc-
 ased by the said Thomas J. Rhyno. Now know ye, That
 the United States of America, in consideration of the premises
 and in conformity with the several act of Congress in
 such case made and provided, Have Given and Granted,
 and by these presents Do Give and Grant, unto the said
 Thomas J. Rhyno and to his heirs, the said Tract above
 described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with
 all the rights, privileges, immunitiees and appurtenances of
 whatsoever nature therunto belonging, unto the said
 Thomas J. Rhyno and to his heirs and assigns forever.

 United States of America, have caused these letters to be mad
 Patent, and the Seal of the General Land office to be
 heremto affixed. Given under my hand, at the city
 of Washington, the Third day of June in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six and of
 the Independence of the United States the eighteenth,
