 William Stoneman Greeting: Whereas William Stoneman of Ma-  
 certificate #7522, diaon County, Iowa, has deposited in the gen-  
 eral land office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of  
 the land office a choriton whereby it appears that full Payment  
 has been made by the said William Stoneman. According to the  
 provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "  
 and act making further provisions for the Sale of the public lands,"  
 for the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section  
 Three, and the North East quarter of the North West quarter of  
 Section Ten in Township Seventy four North of Range Twenty six West,  
 in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at choriton, Iowa, con-  
 taining Eighty acres, According to the Official Plat of the Survey  
 of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the  
 Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the  
 said William Stoneman. Now know ye, that the United  
 States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in con-  
 formity with the several acts of Congress in such case made  
 and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents,  
 Do <sup>give and</sup> Grant, unto the said William Stoneman and to his  
 heirs, the said tract above described: Do Have and Do Hold  
 the same, Together with all the rights, privileges immunities  
 and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging,  
 unto the said William Stoneman and to his heirs and as-  
 signs forever, In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Pierce President  
 of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be  
 made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be  
 hereunto affixed, Given under my hand, at the City  
 of Washington, the third day of June in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred and fifty six, and of the ind-  
 ependence of the United States the Eightieth
