 do by these presents, Remise, Release and Quit-Claim unto the
 Said F. M. Cassidy his heirs and assigns forever, all Our right,
 title and interest in and to the following described Real
 Estate, lying and being situated in the County of Madison
 State of Iowa, to-wit: The East 22 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres of the West 34 acres
 of the South East quarter of the North West quarter of Section (27) Twenty-
 seven; and the West 13 acres of the North half of the South East quarter
 of the North West quarter of Section (7) Seven in Township (16) Seventy-
 six, North of range (27) Twenty seven, West of the 5th P.M., our interest
 having been accrued by virtue of a Pot. Sale held October 11, A.D.
 1869. To Have and To Hold said premises above described unto
 the Said F. M. Cassidy his heirs and assigns forever, And the
 Said Margaret M. Denison wife of the Said Geo. B. Denison hereby
