1873 Deed I know All Men by These Presents: That we
John Miller & Ruth Miller wife of John Miller,
Joseph H. Miller the Grantors for the consideration of four hundred
and Sixty Eight Dollars, received to our full Satisfaction of Joseph H.
Miller the Grantee do give, Grant, Bargain, Sell and convey unto the said
Grantee, his heirs and assigns, the following described premises situated
in the Township of Ohio, County of Madison, and State of Iowa, and
known as the, North East 1/4 of the South East Quarter of Section
Ten (10) Township Sixty four (64) Range Twenty six (26) containing
Forty acres be the same more or less, but subject to all legal highways.
To have and to Hold the above Granted and Bargained premises,
with the appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said Grantee,
his heirs and assigns forever, And the said Grantors do, for themselves,
and heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said
Grantee, his heirs and assigns, that at and until the sealing of
these presents, that they are well seized of the above described Premise
as a good and indefeasible estate in Fee Simple, and have good right
to bargain and sell the same in manner and form as above
written, and that the same are free from all encumbrances
whatever; And will Warrant and Defend said premises, with the
appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Grantee, his heirs and
assigns forever, against all lawful claims and demands whatever.

And the said Ruth Miller, wife of said John Miller do hereby Remise, Relin-
quish and forever quit-claim unto the said Grantee, and his heirs and
assigns, all her right and title of dower in the above described pre-
mises, In witness whereof, we hereunto set our hand and seals, the eighth
day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventy
three, 1873.
