F. J. Cutter, being first duly sworn, says that he is a resident of the City of Marietta, County of Washington, and State of Ohio, and that he is engaged in the practice of the law at said place, and has been a practitioner in said County since April 1875 when he was admitted to the bar to practice law. That he was personally acquainted with one George H. Wells, formerly a resident of said City and County, but now deceased, and knows that said Wells obtained a divorce from his wife at the May Term of the Common Pleas Court of said County, 1870, and did not remarry after that, and that he was an unmarried man in July 1874.

Affiant further says that he has this day personally examined the Court Records of said County, and finds that said George H. Wells commenced suit for divorce in the Common Pleas Court of said Washington County against his wife, Mary E. Wells, on the 8th day of March, 1870, as appears at page 20 of Appearance Docket "P" of said Court, and that a divorce was granted him from his said wife, upon her aggressions, at the May Term, 1870, of said Court, and that the proceedings of said suit are recorded in Vol. 37 at page 413 of the complete Records of said Common Pleas Court. Affiant further says that he has also inquired of relatives of said George H. Wells and learns from them that said George H. Wells did not remarry again after his divorce from his said wife in 1870.
