Be it remembered, that in the above entitled cause, Weldin & Symons a co-partnership, on the 15th day of January A.D. 1904, filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States, in and for the Southern District of Iowa, Central Division, at Des Moines, their voluntary petition in bankruptcy, and on the 23rd day of January A.D. 1904, the Clerk of said Court having transmitted to the undersigned Henry M. Eicher, Referee in Bankruptcy, for the counties of Washington and Keokuk and State of Iowa, said petition, and the certificate of said Clerk showing that the Honorable Smith McPherson United States district Judge in and for said Southern District of Iowa, was absent from the Division of said Southern District of Iowa, in which Washington County is situated; therefore, I, the undersigned, Henry M. Eicher, referee in Bankruptcy for the Counties of Washington and Keokuk and State of Iowa, do hereby assume jurisdiction of said petition and cause, and sitting as a court of bankruptcy, having carefully examined the petition in said cause, and the sched-

ules thereto attached, find that said petition is in conformity with the laws of the United States entitled "An act to establish a uniform system of bankruptcy throughout the United States", approved July 1st 1898 and amendments thereto of February 6th 1903.

And I further find that said copartnership of Weldin & Symons is an actual resident of Mahaska County, State of Iowa, and that its liabilities exceed its assets, and that said copartnership is insolvent, and has not sufficient property which to pay its debts.

It is therefore ordered and adjudged that the said co-partnership and firm of Weldin & Symons be and is hereby adjudged to be and has become a bankrupt within the true intent of the act of Congress entitled, "An act to establish a uniform system of bankruptcy throughout the United States", approved July 1, 1898.

And on this 23rd day of January A.D. 1904 I do hereby adjudge and declare said Weldin & Symons to be a bankrupt accordingly.
