Be it remembered that on the 5th day of October, 1899, the plaintiff in the above entitled action filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Cowley County, Kansas, a petition praying for a divorce from the defendant, Albert P. Johnson, and thereupon a summons is duly issued out of the office of the Clerk of the District Court and is served personally upon the defendant above named on the 7th day of October 1899. And afterwards on the 27th day of November 1899, the defendant files his answer to the petition of the plaintiff.

And afterwards to-wit on the 27th day of November, 1899, the above entitled action comes regularly on for trial upon the petition of the plaintiff and the answer of the defendant and the decree of the court in the above entitled action remains of record in Journal 5 at page 463 of this court in the words and figures following to-wit:-

In the District Court of Cowley County State of Kansas.

Be it remembered that on this 27th day of November A.D. 1899, the same being the 18th judicial day of the regular November term in the year 1899, of the District Court of the Nineteenth Judicial District of the State of Kansas, sitting in and for the County of Cowley, Court convened pursuant to adjournment there being present the honorable W.T. McBride sole presiding Judge of said Court, Chas. C. Craig clerk of said court and S.A. Daniels, sheriff of said County.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had:-

Now on this 27th day of November, 1899, the same being one of the regular days of the November 1899, term of this court, this cause came regularly on for trial, having been reached by the court on its regular assignment, the plaintiff appearing in person and by Madden & Buchanan, her attorneys, the defendant appearing by James McDermott and S.E. Fink, his attorneys, and thereupon the defendant asks leave of the Court to withdraw the error heretofore filed to the petition filed herein, and file an answer and in its place which leave is granted by the court, thereupon the parties being ready for trial, a jury is waived and the matter is submitted for trial to the court. Thereupon the plaintiff introduces her testimony and rests. And after having heard the testimony and being sufficiently advised in the premises the court doth find that the allegations and averments set forth in plaintiff's petition are true and that the plaintiff should be granted a divorce from the defendant for the reasons set out in said petition.

The Court further finds that that the property rights of the parties hereto have been adjusted between them and that no order should be made at this time by the court in reference to the property rights.

It is therefore considered, ordered and adjudged by the court that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the plaintiff, Lu S. Johnson and the defendant Albert P. Johnson, be and the same are hereby dissolved, set aside and held for naught, upon the grounds set forth in said petition, and that the said plaintiff be decreed a divorce herein from said defendant.

It is further ordered and adjudged by the court that the said plaintiff be and she is hereby barred from any right title or interest in and to any property the title of which is now or may hereafter be in the defendant, and that the defendant, Albert P. Johnson, be and he is hereby barred from any right, title or interest in and to any property, the title to which now is or may hereafter be in the plaintiff.

It is further considered, ordered and adjudged by the Court that this decree of divorce entered this 27th day of November, 1899, do not take effect and become final until the expiration of six months from this date.

It is further ordered by the court that the plaintiff pay the costs of this action here now taxed at \$6.85.
