This is to certify that I have been a practicing attorney at law, in the State of Illinois, for over sixteen years last past; and I further certify that I have made a careful and complete examination of the original proceedings had in the Circuit Court of Kane County, in the State of Illinois, in the case of Lena J. Crocker against Sidney Crocker, a proceeding for the dissolution of the marriage existing between them, it is my opinion that the Court had jurisdiction of the parties for the purposes of that suit, and due notice was given the defendant, therein, of said proceedings in accordance with the requirements of the laws of the State of Illinois, that all the proceedings are regularly had in said cause, and that under the laws of the State of Illinois then in force, the decree entered in said cause was valid and sufficient to dissolve such marriage and to divest the defendant, from any right which he might have acquired in the property of the complainant, by reason of such marriage.
