I, Henry Taylor, being duly affirmed under the pains and penalties of the law, do depose and say that I was personally well acquainted with the Joseph Knox, grantee in a certain Warranty deed of date September 3rd, 1892, and recorded on page 400 of Book 32 of the deed records of Madison County, Iowa, his name being written in the body of said deed as Jos. Knox, one and the same, and I know him to be identical with the J.H. Knox, who, his wife joining, was grantor in a cert in warranty deed of date January 18th 1897, and recorded on page 186, of Book 37, of the Deed records of the said Madison County, Iowa, the said Joseph Knox, Jos. Knox and J.H. Knox being one and the same identical person. I further depose and say that I was personally acquainted with the Hannah Taylor, grantee in said deed of date January 18th, 1897, so executed by the said J.H. Knox, she being my wife, and I know that the said Hannah Taylor died intestate, or or about the 30th day of June, A.D. 1905, seized of the East one-half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 24, in Township 77 North, Range 29 West of the 5th P.M. in the said Madison County, Iowa, and I know that all of the debts, costs and charges against the estate of the said Hannah Taylor have been fully paid, including the expenses of her funeral and burial.

That I am the identical Henry Taylor who, on or about the 19th day of March, 1908, executed a certain affidavit as to the heirs-at-law of the said Hannah Taylor, deceased, which said affidavit, I am informed, is recorded on page 630 of Book 16, of the Miscellaneous records of the said Madison County, and if in said affidavit, or the record thereof the name John Petherstone appears, as the husband of Pearl G. Taylor, it is an error in the spelling of his said name, his name, in truth and in fact, being John Weatherstone, and identical with the John Weatherstone, who, his wife Pearl G. Weatherstone joining, executed their certain Quit Claim Deed to this affiant, under date of January 8th, 1908.

I further depose and say that I am personally acquainted with all of the heirs-at-law of the said Hannah Taylor, deceased, and I know that the Orren Taylor against whom unpaid personal taxes are shown on the tax books of Madison County, Iowa for the year 1903, is not an heir-at-law of the said Hannah Taylor, and that said taxes are not a lien against said real estate; further that I know that the J. Taylor, against whom unpaid personal taxes are shown on the tax books of the said Madison County, for the year 1899, is not an heir-at-law of the said Hannah Taylor, and that said taxes are not a lien against said real estate; also, I know that the J.H. Taylor, against whom unpaid personal taxes are shown on the tax books of Madison County, Iowa, for 1900 in Penn Township, for 1901 in Ohio Township, for 1904 in Earlham Township, and for 1905 in Truro Township is not an heir-at-law of the said Hannah Taylor, deceased, and that said taxes are not a lien on the above described real estate.

All of which is true as I verily believe.
