State of Iowa, Madison County, ss:

I, Isaac Reager, now of Norcatur, Kansas, on oath say that I came to Madison County, Iowa, in the year 1853, and entered land in Section five (5), township seventy-four (74) north, of range twenty-seven (27), west of the 5th P.M., Iowa, and that I resided thereon continuously for more than fifty years; that I was a cousin of Francis M. Reager, who entered the south east quarter (1/4) of the north east quarter (1/4) of section one (1), township seventy four (74) north, of range twenty eight (28), west of the 5th P.M. Iowa, about two miles from where I lived; that I was well acquainted with said Francis M. Reager during his residence in Madison County, Iowa, from about the year 1853 until after the close of the civil war; that during all of that period he was a single and unmarried man.

That where the name Francis M. Reager or Francis M. Roger appears on the book of original entries of Madison County, Iowa, the same man Francis M. Reager is referred to; that he was the same man as the Francis M. Reager or Franc M. Reager who on or about June 6th, 1857, sold and conveyed said land unto David Claggett, and that at that time he was a single man.

That as I recollect the matter Hanson Reager sold to Francis M. Reager a forty acre tract of land in Section six (6), in township seventy four (74), range twenty seven (27), west of the 5th P.M. Iowa, being just across the section line from the above described land entered by Francis M. Reager, and that Francis M. Reager afterwards sold and conveyed said land to John Steel, his brother in law; and that in a conveyance appearing on deed record "P" of Madison County, Iowa, from Francis M. Reager to John Steel, at page 65 of said record, there is a misdescription of the land attempted to be conveyed, and that it should have been described as in Section six (6), township seventy four (74), range twenty seven (27), instead as of land in section one (1), township seventy four (74), range twenty eight (28), as it does appear.

That John Steel never owned said land in said section one (1), but did as I remember it, own land in section six (6) bought from Francis M. Reager, and that John Steel never took possession of or claimed said land in section one (1), but that it has always been in the actual and undisputed possession of David Claggett, the grantee of said Francis M. Reager, and his grantees, and the apparent conveyance of it to him was through an error in description.

All of said statements are true as I believe.
