State of Iowa, Madison County, ss:

I, S.S. Morgan of said County and State being duly sworn depose and say that I have been a resident of the Town of St Charles in said County and vicinity for thirty eight years last past, that I was well and personally acquainted with one Jesse C. Young, who laid out a part of said Town of St Charles, and his family, that the only heirs at law of said Jesse C. Young deceased were as follows:

1 His widow Mary Jane Young, who also died on or about 1871, unmarried and intestate, 2 George M. Young, 3 Mary E. intermarried with Joseph Mc Armstrong, 4 J.A. Young, 5 J.W. Young, and that said heirs at law of said Jesse C. Young deceased were all and the only heirs at law of said Mary Jane Young deceased.

That I was well acquainted with the grantors in a deed to Wm M. Anderson recorded page 293, Volume 4, deed records of Madison County, Iowa, filed for record November 21, 1889 conveying Lot 4 in South West Section of Town of St Charles Iowa, and that J.A. Young therein a grantor was at the time unmarried; that C.B. Gill a grantor therein was formerly the wife of G.E. Young another grantor therein the two having been previously divorced.

That on February 10, 1859 I was well acquainted with G.A. Quick and Elizabeth Quick who on that date conveyed the aforesaid lot to one F.N. Hogue, and at said date said G.A. Quick & Elizabeth Quick were wife and husband. That I never heard of said F.N. Hogue being married.

Further deponent saith not.
