State of Indiana, Boone County SS.

I, Thomas J. Vice, a resident of said county and state, of the age of 65 years, being first duly sworn, on my oath depose and say as follows: That I am a son of Hiram Vice, who died, testate, in said county and state on or about the 23 day of August A.D. 1853, seized in fee simple of certain lands in Madison county, Iowa. That the said Hiram Vice left a widow surviving him, her name being Margaret Vice, and that he also left surviving him as his only children the following named persons, to-wit: John A. Vice, his son; Martha A. Vice, his daughter; Ellen Laughlin, his daughter, intermarried with John M. Laughlin; and this affiant, Thomas J. Vice, his son. That the foregoing named persons constituted the sole and only heirs at law of the said Hiram Vice, deceased. That the said Margaret Vice, surviving widow of the said Hiram Vice, deceased, elected to take under the provisions of the will of the said decedent, and that during her lifetime she never made any claim upon the estate of said decedent for her distributive share or dower right, and that the said Margaret Vice, widow of the said decedent died intestate in Boone county Indiana, leaving as her sole heirs at law the aforesaid children of the said Hiram Vice, deceased. That the estates of the said Hiram Vice and the said Margaret Vice, his widow, were long since fully settled and all claims against the same paid in full, including a bequest in the last will and testament of the said Hiram Vice, deceased, to his brother, Alfred Vice, for the sum of \$100.00, to be paid to him out of the proceeds of the sale of the real estate in Madison County, Iowa. That the aforesaid children of Hiram Vice, deceased, were the sole and only heirs at law of said decedent on the 3rd and 11th days of February, 1869, and that on said last mentioned dates the said John A. Vice, Martha R. Vice and this affiant were each single and unmarried persons of full lawful age and competent to convey real estate, and that also on said last mentioned dates the said Ellen Laughlin and John M. Laughlin were husband and wife. Further affiant saith not.
