I, William James, of Madison County, Iowa, on oath say that I am a nephew of John James who entered from the United States Government the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirteen (13), in Township seventy five (75) North, of Range Twenty eight (28), West of the 5th P.M., Iowa; that I was acquainted with John James and his family in the State of Indiana before I came to Iowa with my father in 1854; that said John James and his family came to Iowa and settled in Madison County about two years later; that John James died in Madison County, Iowa, about the year 1858 leaving surviving his widow, Lucretia James, and the following named children: John James, whose wife was Sarah J. James, Nathan H. or N.H. James whose wife was Keziah E. James, Benjamin James whose wife was Lucinda James, George or George W. James whose wife was Lendency S. James, William James was unmarried, and Henry James who was unmarried until after the year 1870, Unice James who married Isaac Dubois, Margaret James who married George Cunningham, Ellen James who married Joseph Cunningham, and Mary James who married John C. Bush, and afterwards died leaving surviving her husband and one child William Henry Bush. That Lucretia James the widow of John James never remarried, and died intestate in Madison County, Iowa, about the year 1868, leaving surviving her only the heirs at law above named, and none other. That all of the foregoing facts are stated of my own personal knowledge.
