I, Anna Donahue, of said County and State on oath say that I am the widow of Michael Donahue who formerly owned the South half (1/2) of the North West Quarter (1/4) of Section (12), and the North West Quarter (1/4) of the South West Quarter (1/4) of Section one (1/4) in Township Seventy six (76) North, of range twenty seven (27) west of the 5th P.N., IOWA; that I lived continuously on said land from August 17th, 1874, until about March 1st, 1909. That Willard Lease or W.N. Lease at no time owned said land or any part thereof or had any interest therein; that meanly and setten his death myself and family or some interest therein; that myself and husband, and after his death myself and family or some mombers thereof lived on said land, and occupied and used all of it; (that said Lease did at one time own the North half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  of the North West Quarter  $(\frac{1}{4})$  of said Section twelve (12) one time own the North half (\frac{1}{2}) of the North West Quarter (\frac{1}{4}) of said Section twelve (12) in the township and range aforesaid, but that he did not at any time own the South half (\frac{1}{2}) of said Quarter Section, or have any possession thereof or of any part of it, and that the two mortgages executed by said W.N. Lease or Willard Lease, which appear to be upon the South half (\frac{1}{2}) of said Quarter Section, appear to be executed thereon only through error and mistake in the description of the land intended to be covered and included therein.

That I know James Clondenin who on or about July 10th, 1875, executed an instrument recorded in mortgage record six (6) of Madison County, Iowa, at page 139 thereof, which it is claimed creates a cloud upon the title to the North West Quarter (\frac{1}{2}) of the South West Quarter (\frac{1}{2}) of Soction one (1) in said Township and range; that said Clondonin did own the South West Quarter (+) of the South East Quarter (+) of said Section, but never ewned the North West Quarter (+) of the South West Quarter (+) of said Section or had any interest therein of any kind, or any possession of the same or any part of it; that at the time of the execution of said instrument and ever since myself and husband and since his death myself and family of said instrument and ever since myself and husband and since his death myself and family or some of them have been in the possession and occupancy of the whole of said land, and no one ever interfered with or questioned the title and right to possession of my husband, and since his death of myself and children or James Donahue my son, to whom we conveyed our interest therein. That I never knew personally John C. Temlinson who on or about October 29th, 1851, conveyed unto Thomas Quillin the south east quarter  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of the north west quarter east quarter  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of Section eleven (11), the south half  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of the north west quarter  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of Section twelve (12), and the north west quarter  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of the south west Quarter  $(\frac{1}{7})$  of section one (1), all in the township and range aforesaid, but that I have often heard in the neighborhood of the said John C. Temlinson, and heard of him, and that by reputation he was then a single and unmarried man, and I believe he was.
