	I, D.G. Ratliff, of said County and State, on oath say that I was acquainted with the family of Isaac Jessup, who died testate in Madison County, Iowa, on or about March 14th, A.D. 1901. That said Isaac Jessup left surviving a widow, Malinda Jessup, and as his heirs at law Harvey Z. Jessup, Daniel H. Jessup, George T. Jessup, William O. Jessup, and Charles E. Jessup. That the Harry J. Jessup referred to in the record of the will of said Isaac Jessup was the same and identical man as Harvey Z. Jessup, above named, and as Harvey Zebulon Jessup referred to in the registry of heirs, the discrepancy being occasioned by clerical error of illegible writing; that the Daniel Jessup referred to in the matters connected with the estate of said Isaac Jessup was the same and identical person as said Daniel H. Jessup, as was also David Harberson Jessup, the discrepancy in names being occasioned by mistake or misunderstanding or clerical error; that George Taylor Jessup and George T. Jessup was one and the same man; and William O. Jessup and William Oliver Jessup was one and the same man; that Henry Z. Jessup referred to in the settlement of the estate of said Isaac Jessup was the same and identical man as said Harvey Z. Jessup, the mistake and discrepancy being due to carelessness or misunderstanding. That I have no interest in the making of this affidavit, but that the matters above stated are true as I believe.
