I, Samuel L. Holliday, a resident of Livingston
Park County, Montana being first duly sworn upon my oath depose and say that I am a
son of John P. Holliday and Ann Holliday-Davidson, deceased. That the James J. Holliday
Samuel L. Holliday, Vinton G. Holliday, Alexander M. Holliday and Joseph C. Holliday,
named as grantees in a certain deed recorded in Deed Record "A" page 19 of the records
of Madison County Iowa, were children of the said John P. Holliday and Ann Holliday,
and that the said Ann Holliday was the mother of each of them. That the said James J.
Holliday and Joseph C. Holliday died while minors, unmarried, intestate and without
issue, leaving their mother, the said Ann Holliday their only heir at law. That the
said Ann Holliday afterwards, on November 18th 1855, was married to one W.E. Davidson,
who died in the year 1896, and prior to the death of the said Ann Holliday-Davidson,
whose death occurred in the year 1899, leaving as her sole and only heirs at law, the
