Holleday grantees in a deed of conveyance from Ann Davidson, formerly Ann Holledy, dated August 4th, 1858, conveying the Southeast Quarter (1/4) of Section Twenty Six (26) in Township Seventy-six (76) North, of Range Twenty-eight (28) West of the 5th P.M. and well and personally know that the said Samuel L. Holledy is the same and identical person as Samuel L. Holliday, who with his wife, Maria E. conveyed said land to Vinton G. Holliday by deed dated January 1st, 1866, and that the aforesaid Alexander M. Holleday is the same and identical person as Alexander M. Holliday, who conveyed said land to Vinton G. Holliday by deed dated November 7th, 1866, and that the said Vinton G. Holledy, one of the aforesaid grantees from Ann Davidson is the same and identical person as the Vinton G. Holliday, grantee in the aforesaid deeds from Samuel L. Holliday and wife, and Alexander M. Holliday, and that he is the same and identical person as Vinton G. Holliday, who with his wife, Mary E. conveyed said land to David W. Burnett by deed dated November 13th, 1866. That the said Samuel L. Holliday, Vinton G. Holliday and Alexander M. Holliday were brothers and the said Ann Davidson was their mother, and that the correct spelling of their name was "Holliday" and not "Holledy" Further affiant saith not.
