That in 1855 additional lots were platted to the Original Plat known as Hartman & Youngs Addition, and the Street on the South and side of said Addition was called Clanton Street, the said Jesse C. Young owning the South part of the said platted portion of St Charles and George Hartman the North part thereof. That Jesse C. Young died sometime in 1864 intestate owning the South part of the SW 1884 Sec. 24-75-26 South of Clanton Street which street was on the South side of the platted Portion of St Charles, and that his widow Mary Jane Young who died sometime in 1872 intestate living at the time of her death upon the South part of said SW4 NW4 Sec. 24-75-26 which was still in the name of Jesse C. Young. That at her death she was unmarried and left as her heirs and all and only heirs at law G.M. Young, J.W. Young, J.A. Young, and Mary E. Young, intermarried with J. Mc. Armstrong, That in a certain deed in which G.M. Young and wife Clara B. Young convoy the undivided & interest in 18 acres of land of the SW# NW# Sec. 24-75-26 the said rend was located in the South part of the said SW# NW# South of the platted portion of the Town of St Charles and would be about 18 acros in extent.
