State of Iowa Madison County SS:

I, Martha J. Garrett, a resident of said County and State, being first duly sworn, on my oath depose and say that I am the surviving widow of William Phillips, deceased, who died, testate, in Madison County, Iowa, on or about December 17th, 1874; that on or about December 17th, 1876, I was intermarried with Solomon Garrett, who is now deceased. That the said William Phillips left surviving him as his only heirs at law two sons, George Oliver Phillips and Alva J. Phillips, and his daughter, Dora B. Phillips. That the said George Oliver Phillips died about eighteen years ago, and that the bequest of \$100.00, made to said George Oliver Phillips by his father, the said William Phillips in his last will and testament, was long since and during the life time of the said George Oliver Phillips, paid to him in full. That the said Dora B. Phillips intermarried with J.H. Hockenberry on or about January 29th, 1891. That the said Dora B. Hockenberry died, intestate, on or about December 30th, 1901, leaving surviving her, her husband, the said J.H. Hockenberry and as her only child and heir at law, Blanche Hockenberry, who has made her home with me for about ten years last past. That the said Blanche Hockenberry was nineteen years of age on November 17th 1910. That no administration was ever made upon the estate of the said Dora B. Hockenberry, but that her estate was fully settled and all debts and claims against the same fully paid and discharged several years ago. That I was well and personally acquainted with William McAferty, who conveyed the South Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Northeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32) in Township Seventy-six (76) North of Range Twenty nine (29) to Johnathan S. Phillips by deed dated October 22nd, 1866, and know that he is the same and identical person as William McAferty, grantee in a deed from Miles H. Earle, dated April 24th, 1865, conveying the Southeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of said Section, Township and range. That I was well and personally acquainted with Jacob Pugh, who, with his wife, Adanizah, conveyed to William McAferty, the forty acres last above described by deed dated January 13th, 1863, and know that he is the same and identical person as Jacob Pew, grantee in a deed from Manning Drake and wife, Henrietta, dated June 23rd, 1862, conveying Forty acres last above described. That Jonathan S. Phillips, grantor in a deed to William Phillips, dated February 18th, 1869, conveying the South Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the Northeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32) and Southwest Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty Three, of said Township and range, is a brother of the said William Phillips, deceased, and is the same and identical person as Johnathan S. Phillips, grantee in a deed from William McAferty, dated October 22nd, 1866, conveying South Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Northeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two, in said Township and Range. Further affiant saith not.
