first duly sworn, on my eath depose and say that I have resided in Madison County, Iowa,
for 53 years and have resided near the land hereinafter described for about 53 years.

That I am a son of Andrew H. Bertholf and Electa Bertholf, his wife. That Andrew Bertholf,
to whom the State 16-75-28 was patented by the State of Iowa was my father and the same
person as Andrew H. Bertholf, and that the said Andrew Bertholf and A.H. Bertholf, who with Electa Bertholf, executed a deed dated January 21st, 1875, and recorded in Deed Record 10, page 487 of the records of said County, were the same person, and the said Electa Bertholf was the wife of the said A.H. Bertholf on the date of said conveyance. That the said Andrew Was the wirs of the said A.H. Bertholf on the date of said conveyance. That the said Andrew H. Bertholf died, testate, in said county, on or about July 15th, 1878, leaving as his heirs at law his widow, the said Electa Bertholf, and the following named children:—
A.M. Bertholf, Zach Bertholf, James Bertholf, W.H. Bertholf, J.M. Bertholf, Rebecca Kiggins L.M. Bertholf, and Samuel M. Demar and Alex W. Demar, the two last mentioned being grand-children, the children of a deceased daughter of the said Andrew H. Bertholf.

Vermillion, one of the grantees in a deed from the Sheriff of Madison County, Iowa, dated April 19th, 1876, recorded in Deed Record A, page 63, convoying the undivided one-half of E 3/4 SF4 NE4 16-75-28, and also knew Amanda Vermillion, the other grantee in said deed, and know that they were the same persons as R.D. Vermillion and wife, A.C. Wermillion, who conveyed said land to W.H. Stoole, by deed dated March 13th, 1875, and recorded in Deed who conveyed said land to W.H. That the S.E. Evans, grantee in a deed from Thomas Miller and wife, dated September 4th, 1880, and recorded in Deed Record No. 18 page 450, conveying the E 3/4 SE\ NE\ 16-75-28 is the same person as Sylvester E. Evans, named in the registry of heirs in the estate of James W. Evans. deceased. as one of the heirs of said decodent, and also the same person James W. That the books and pages of records referred to above in all instances refer to the records of Medison County, Idwa. That I have no interest whatever in making the foregoing affidavit or in any of the land referred to.
