State of Iowa, Madison County SS:

I, H.P. Cunningham, first being duly sworn depose and say that I have been a resident of Madison County, Iowa, for many years; that I was well and personally acquainted with John E. Harrison, who died in Madison County, Iowa, intestate in the year 1873; that I was also well and personally acquainted with his family and the various members thereof that Mary E. Harrison was his surviving widow, and the mother of all the children of the said John E. Harrison; that George W. Harrison and Mary Alice Harrison a son and daughter of the said John E. Harrison and Mary E. Harrison died subsequent to the death of the said John E. Harrison, intestate, unmarried and without issue; that said Mary E. Harrison was a single and unmarried woman on August 20th 1880 when she conveyed her interest in the North East Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section Twenty-one (21) in Township Seventy Five (75) North, Range Twenty Nine (29) West of the 5th P.M. to William F. Rice; that Sarah E. Harrison the daughter of the said John E. Harrison and said Mary E. Harrison, intermarried with one H.P. Cunningham, and as Sarah E. Cunningham, together with her said husband H.P. Cunningham, conveyed to the said William F. Rice, by warranty deed, dated August 20th 1880 the undivided one-ninth interest in said real estate; that I know the foregoing statements to be true from my own personal knowledge, and that I have no personal interest to serve, other than to establish the facts of record.
