State of Iowa, Madison County SS:

I, J.E. Hamilton being first duly sworn on oath depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with all the heirs at law of Jesse Painter and Susanah Painter, both deceased; that the said Jesse Painter departed this life intestate on or about the 17th day of August 1860 leaving as his sole and only heirs at law, his widow Susanah Painter, and the following named children, to-wit: Rhoda Painter, Dosha Painter, John T. Painter, Helena Painter, Virginia Painter, Dayton Painter, William Painter and David Painter; that the said Susanah Painter died intestate a widow, on or about the 9th day of June 1865, and that she left as her sole and only heirs at law the same children named as heirs of her deceased husband, Jesse Painter. That the above named Rhoda Painter intermarried with one Thos. F. Bryan; that Dosha Painter intermarried with one Paul Macy; that Virginia Painter intermarried with one Quimby Pierce. That wherever the names of Susanah Painter, Susan Painter, and Susannah Painter; Rhoda Painter and Rhoda Bryan; Dosha Painter and Dosha Macy; or Virginia Painter and Virginia Pierce appears in connection with the title to the S<sub>1</sub> SW<sub>1</sub> Sec. 27-74-27, they all respectively refer to one identical and the same person.
