I, C.C. Miller, of said County and State on oath say that I am a son of William Miller who died intestate in Madison County, Iowa, about April 20th, 1883, owning at the time of his death lot one (1) in the north east quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section One (1) in Township seventy five (75) North, of range twenty eight (28), west of the 5th P.M. Iowa; that that was all of the real estate which the said William Miller owned in said section at the time of his death; that the estate of said William Miller has long since been fully and finally settled and all his debts paid. That said William Miller left surviving him his widow Louisa Miller, and as his only heirs at law his children C.C. Miller, (myself), Eliza A. Beard, Cynthia Benson, and his grand children, children of Margaret Darnall, (a daughter who died prior to the death of said William Miller) Elmer E. Darnall, Sarah M. Low, John Darnall, Lee Darnall, and Samuel Darnall; that Elenor Darnall who is named in the registry of heirs of said William Miller is so named by mistake, Elmer E. Darnall being meant; that Sarah Low and Sarah M. Low was one and the same person, and that Cynthia Benson named in the registry of heirs is the same person as Syntha or Cynthia Benson named in a deed of conveyance of said land made by his heirs who had attained their majority to George Pratt; that at the time of making said conveyance all the heirs at law of said William Miller had attained their majority except John Darnall and Lee Darnall, the ages of the heirs being given in the registry of heirs as they were at the time of the death of William Miller.
