State of South Dakota, Miner County SS:

I, Cora E. Duff, a resident of said County and State, being first duly sworn on my oath depose and say that I am a daughter of James E. Wight, who died in Madison County, Iowa, on or about November 1st, 1876, and am the same person as Cora E. Wight, named in the registry of heirs filed in the estate of said decedent. That I was born on the 22nd day of November, 1871. That in a certain action of partition in the Circuit Court of Madison County, Iowa, wherein H.M. Wight was plaintiff and Ida May Wight and this affiant were defendants, being the October Term A.D. 1877 of said Court, certain lands in Madison County, Iowa, belonging to the said James E. Wight at the time of his decease, were set off to this affiant, and that such partition and division made by the referees appointed by the Court in said cause, was and is and at all times since the making thereof, has been entirely satisfactory to this affiant and was fully accepted by this affiant long after reaching her majority, and is now so accepted, as her rightful share of the real estate belonging to said estate. That the Ida May Wight, named in the registry of heirs filed in the estate of said decedent, and also named as one of the defendants in the above mentioned action of partition, is the same and identical person as Ida May Friberg, who died in Madison County, Iowa, on or about August 3rd, 1892.
