I, John Hamilton being duly sworn, do say that I am now, and have been for 43 years, a resident of Madison County, and am acquainted with the persons named in the following affidavit: That the Crystal Mae Hoisington, who is named as grantor in the deed to C.A. Robbins, dated December 14th, 1910, and recorded in Deed Record 40, Page 440, of Madison County, and who is also named in the petition for the appointment of a guardian, filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court, of Madison County, on the third day of April, 1909, and the Crystal Mae Hoisington, who on February 23, 1909, filed the objections to the probating of the will of A.J. Hoisington, deceased, and who is named in the said petition, for the appointment of a guardian, filed in the Clerk's office, on the third day of April, 1909, and who is also named as one of the defendants in the action to partition the real estate, of which A.J. Hoisington died seized, in which action, Victoria Johnson and others, were plaintiffs, and James L. Hoisington and others, were defendants, and in which, the petition was filed on the thirtieth day of August, 1909, and who is also named as one of the plaintiffs in an action against S.B. Johnson, as executor and others, which action is docketed in Docket "U", page 156, of Madison County, and in which action, a petition was filed, May 21, 1909, and that the Chrystal Mae Hoisington, who is named in a decree entered on the petition of intervention, filed by C.A. Robbins, as intervenor, in said action, in which said Victoria Johnson, and others, were plaintiffs, and James L. Hoisington and others, were defendants, is one and the same person, and whosoever the name Crystal Mae Hoisington, or Crystal Mae Hoisington or Chrystal Mae Hoisington appears, in any of the proceedings or pleadings or records above referred to, it refers to one and the same person. That the Lillian H. Hoisington, who is one of the defendants in the said partition action, in which Victoria Johnson and others were Plaintiffs, and James L. Hoisington, and others were defendants, that the Lillian Hazel Hoisington, who is named in the order or decree filed in said case on the nineteenth day of October, 1910, the Lillian Hazel Hoisington, who is an application for reappraisal, filed in said cause on the eighth day of May, 1911, and in the petition of intervention, filed in said cause on November 20, 1911, by C.A. Robbins, as intervenor, and who is also named in the petition for the appointment of guardian, filed in the office of the Clerk on April 3, 1909, and who is named as one of the plaintiffs in said action, in which Crystal Mae Hoisington and others were plaintiffs, and S.B. Johnson, as executor, and others were defendants, and in the decree, entered in said action, and the Lillian Hazel Smith, who is named in the decree entered in said petition of intervention, by C.A. Robbins, is one and the same person, and that wherever the name Lillian H. Hoisington, Lillian Hazel Hoisington, or Lillian Hazel Hoisington, or Lillian Hazel Smith appears in the records of any of the proceedings, named herein, it refers to one and the same person. That the Martha E. Hardenburger, who is named as one of the heirs of A.J. Hoisington, deceased, in the registry of his heirs, filed in Madison County, and as one of the defendants in the said action to partition said real estate, of which said A.J. Hoisington died seized, and in the supplemental petition and decree filed in said action, the Martha E. Hardenburger, who is named as one of the heirs of Elizabeth Hoisington in the registry of her heirs, filed in Madison County, and who is also named in the notice of said supplemental petition, and in the publishers proof of service of said notice, and in the affidavit for service of said notice by publication, is one and the same person, and that wherever the name, Martha E. Hardenburger, or Martha E. Hardenburger appears, in any of said proceedings, or the records thereof, it refers to one and the same person. That William Hardenburger, is the husband of said Martha E. Hardenburger, and that he is the same person whose name is also given in said proceedings and records as William Hardenburger. That the Bryce Glenn Etchison, who is named as a defendant in the said action in which Victoria Johnson and others were plaintiffs, and James L. Hoisington and others were defendants, the Bryce G Etchison, who is named as one of the heirs of A.J. Hoisington, in the registry of his heirs, filed in Madison County, and in the registry of heirs of Elizabeth Hoisington, filed in said county, and who is also named in said supplemental petition filed in said partition action, and in the original notice of the filing of said supplemental petition, and in the publisher's proof of service of said notice, and in the affidavit for service of said notice by publication, and in the supplemental decree entered in said cause and in the order appointing C.A. Robbins, Guardian ad litem, and in his answer, filed therein, is one and the same person, and that wherever the name Bryce Glenn Etchison and Bryce G. Etchison is found, in any of the pleadings, or proceedings or record thereof, above named and described, it refers to one and the same person.
