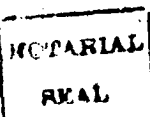

State of Iowa, Madison County, SS. I, C.P. Cline being first duly sworn, on oath, depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with Fredrick Cline, who died seized of the following described land in Madison County, Iowa, namely; The east half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the southeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section eleven (11), and all that part of the west thirty (30) acres of the southeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the northeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section eleven (11) lying south of North River; all in township seventy six (76), north, range twenty nine (29), west of the Fifth Principal Meridian; That the said Frederick Cline died leaving surviving him his widow, Mary Cline, and his children C.P. Cline and George W. Cline. I further state that no child or children of any deceased child or children of the said Frederick Cline survived him, nor did any adopted child or descendant of any adopted child survive him. I also state that, upon the death of Mary Cline, the widow of the said Frederick Cline, there survived her as her children only the said C.P. Cline and George W.
