State of Iowa, Madison County, SS. I, J. W. Bradshaw Jr. of said State and County first being duly sworn upon oath depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with the family of Jackson H. Kale who died intestate August 27th, 1863, seized in fee of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  4-74-26, leaving as his heirs and only heirs at law the following:- Elizabeth J. Kale, his widow, and Rebecca M. Kale, Edmund A. Kale, Nancy E. Kale and George M. Kale his children. I further state that I was well and personally acquainted with George M. Kale who was grantor in a certain deed of Quit Claim, dated December 16th, 1874, conveying the undivided one-fourth of said land to one John Stewart, and that to my personal knowledge the said George M. Kale was an unmarried man at the time he executed said deed.

I further state that I was well and personally acquainted with Nancy E. Kale who was an heir at law of the said Jackson H. Kale and that to my personal knowledge the said Nancy E. Kale intermarried with one Adelphus Bradfield, Jr. on September 26th, 1868, and that to my personal knowledge the said Nancy E. Bradfield and A. Bradfield whose husband and wife September 11th, 1871, at which time they executed a deed of quit claim conveying the undivided one-fourth of said land to one Elizabeth J. Kale.

I further state that I was well and personally acquainted with Rebecca M. Kale who was an heir at law of the said Jackson H. Kale, and that to my personal knowledge the said Rebecca M. Kale intermarried with one John Stewart on January 15th, 1871, and that to my personal knowledge the said Rebecca M. Stewart and John Stewart were husband and wife at the time they united in a certain deed of warranty, with E. J. Kale and E. A. Kale, conveying said land to one John W. Peek, and that to my personal knowledge the said E. J. Kale and E. A. Kale were each unmarried at the time they executed said deed, the said E. J. Kale being the widow of said Decedent, and the said E. A. Kale being the same and identical person as Edmund A. Kale.
