Thornbrugh, being first duly sworn on my oath depose and say that I am a resident of Madison county, Iowa, and have been a resident of said county and state for the last 50 years. That I was well and personally acquainted with Samuel Crawford, who at one time owned the East Half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the South West Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the South west Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Five (5) and the East Half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the West Half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the North West Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Eight (8) in Township Seventy-five (75) North, Range Twenty-seven (27) West of the 5th P.M., during his lifetime. That the said Samuel Crawford died intestate, on or about the year 1890 leaving as his <sup>and only</sup> sole heirs at law the following named persons, to-wit:- Polly Crawford, his widow; Anna Butler, his daughter, intermarried with James Butler; Janos Crawford, his son; Mary Morrison, his daughter, intermarried with William F. E. Chenoweth, <sup>L. E. Chenoweth,</sup> A. L. Chenoweth, and E. P. Oylear and husband, George Oylear, children of said Rebecca Chenoweth, and her only heirs at law. That the said Samuel Crawford died in the State of Idaho and his estate was fully settled and debts paid and no administration was ever had on his estate, as the affiant herein is informed and believes.
