Potter during his lifetime and with the members of his family at the time of his decease and since that time

That he left surviving him his widow Melinda Potter, and his Children and sole and only heirs at law Andrew H. Potter, Celestia C.J. Potter, C. Sidney Potter, Van R. Potter Ingebee Potter, and David Potter, That Melinda Potter and Celestia C.J. Potter were each single and unmarried persons on October 13th 1874, when they joined as grantors with others in a deed to Lewis M. Yocum, conveying the E $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 23-76-27, which deed is recorded in deed record No. 10 page 351 of the records of Madison County, Iowa.

That the estate of said David H. Potter was fully settled and his debts all paid without Administration in the said Madison County Iowa.

That the said David H. Potter died prior to October 13th 1874 intestate, seized of the above described real estate.
