State of Iowa Madison County, SS.I, J.E.Tidrick, of said County and State, being first duly sworn, do, upon my oath, depose and say:—That I was well and personally acquainted with C.D.Bevington, of Madison County, Iowa, who died intestate on or about November 13<sup>th</sup> 1903 and whose estate was probated in Madison County, Iowa, and is shown in Probate Docket "E" at page 152 of the records of the District Court of said county: that I knew said C.D.Bevington intimately and well for more than 25 years last preceding his death having lived from infancy on the street leading from his residence in Winterset, Iowa to the business part of the town and seeing him almost daily and frequently several times a day going to and from his business: that said C.D.Bevington and his family and my father and our family were socially intimately acquainted during all that time, the said C.D.Bevington and my father and mother being "Old Settlers" of Madison County, Iowa, coming here in the early 50's, and all prior to 1860. That I am, and since 1897 have been, a practicing attorney in Winterset, Iowa, and as such assisted the Administrators in the closing of his estate, and know of my own personal knowledge that the said C.D.Bevington left no widow surviving him at the time of his death and know, of my own knowledge, that his last wife died in Madison County, Iowa in the month of October, A.D.

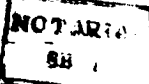
