

State of Iowa, Madison County, SS. I, W.P. Love a resident of said County and State

being first duly sworn on my oath depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with Helen M. Armstrong, who is grantee in a deed from Charles S. Armstrong, and wife, dated November 28th, 1885, conveying the undivided one-half of E $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 13-74-29, her name in the record of such conveyance being spelled Hellen M. Armstrong; that the said Helen M. Armstrong died intestate in Madison County Iowa, on or about --- day of --- A.D. 1902; that no administration was ever had upon the estate of the said Helen M. Armstrong, but that all indebtedness of her estate was fully paid and settled; that the said Helen M. Armstrong, left surviving her the following named children, to-wit, Anna M. Armstrong, Helen N. Armstrong and Luella E. Maxwell, who was intermarried with one E.J. Maxwell; that she also left surviving her, her husband W. H. Armstrong; that she left surviving her no children of any deceased child, and that she had no adopted children; that the above named persons constitute the sole and only heirs at law of the said Helen M. Armstrong, deceased. That I was well and personally acquainted with William H. Armstrong, who at one time was the owner of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 13-74-29, & NW frac. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec 13-74-28, and that wherever in connection or W.H. Armstrong with the title to said real estate the name of William H. Armstrong appear, they in each and every instance refer to one and the same identical person, William H. Armstrong, he being the surviving husband of the said Helen M. Armstrong, above referred to.
