State of Iowa Madison County.ss. I, R.F.Brown, of said County and State, being first duly sworn, do, upon my oath, depose and say:- That I am a son of the George Brown named as grantor in a certain deed to Rebecca C. Brown, dated March 5th, 1909, recorded in Deed Record 49 at Page 295 of the deed records of Madison County, Iowa, conveying the N $\frac{1}{2}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  33-77-28, except a strip off the East end 2 rods wide and East 10 acres of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  33-77-28 and know of my own personal knowledge that the Geo Brown, against whom certain personal taxes were levied in Scott Township, in said County, in 1897 and in Union Township, in said county, in 1902, was another and different person from my father, the said George Brown who was the owner of the said real estate during said years. That my father never lived in or had any personal property in either Union Township or Scott Township, Madison County, Iowa, but lived on said place at all times from about the time he bought it in 1855 up to about the year 1897 when he removed to Stuart, in Adair County, Iowa where he continued to reside at all times until his death in June 1909.

That said personal taxes are not and never have been a lien against said property but were assessed and levied against some other Geo.Brown and not against my said father.
