with Sarah Doan to whom John A.Rogers and Mary Rogers conveyed the above described land by deed dated October 17" 1857 and recorded in Record "H", page 191, and know of my own personal knowledge that she was the same and identical person as Sarah Done who joined in conveying said land to John Eskew by deed dated February 9" 1865 and recorded in Record "P", page 75, her correct name being Sarah Doan, that the William Doan who joined in said last mentioned conveyance was at the date thereof, the husband of the said Sarah Doan, also that the John A.Rogers and Mary Rogers who joined in the above mentioned conveyance recorded in Record "H", page 191, were husband and wife on said October 17" 1857.

Eskow, Mary A. Cartor, Martha E. Jesse, or M. E. Jesse, Alexander Eskow, Ellen Eskew, Amelia Fudge and Sarah Kinnaird, that the John M. Eskew, Mary A. Carter, M E. Jesse, Alexander Eskow and Ellen Eskew who joined in convoying to Henry Pudge the undivided 5/7 of above described land by deed deted November 13" 1650 and recorded in Deed Record 17, page, 2, were the same and identical persons as the ones named as heirs at law of John Eskew, that the Saruh Eskew who conveyed said real estate to Henry Pudge by Quit Claim Deed dated November 13" 1880 and recorded in Deed Record 14, page 262, was the above mentioned widow of John Eskew, that the Henry Pudge named in the last two above described conveyances was the same and identical person as the W.H.Fudge who together with his wife Amelia Fudge, conveyed the undivided 6/7 of the above described land to G.J.
