We, T.V. Dugan and W.H. Thompson, of said

county and state, being first duly sworn, do, upon oath depose and say that we are the acting Pastor and member of the Board of Elders respectively, of the United Presbyterian Church of North America, located at Winterset, Madison County, Iowa, and that we are personally and well acquainted with the formation and official designation of said Church Society, that we know of the bequest to said Church Society by James Loughridge, deceased, and know that the bequest made in the seventh paragraph of the last will and testament of the said James Loughridge, deceased, to "The Foreign Mission Society of the United Presbyterian Church of America, with headquarters at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania," was in truth and in fact, intended for and to go to The Board of Foreign Missions of the United Presbyterian Church of North America, and know that "The Board of Foreign Mission of the United Presbyterian Church of North America," named as one of the grantors in a deed dated March 1, 1911, and recorded in Deed Record 50, at page 135 of the Deed Records of Madison County, Iowa, conveying W $\frac{1}{2}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 3, and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 4-7-28, except one acre in southeast corner of Sec 4, and except a strip forty feet wide across the south end of W $\frac{1}{2}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  and except one-half acre on the north line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$  for cemetery, was in truth and in fact, the same identical Society as the devisee, "The foreign Mission Society of the United Presbyterian Church of America, with headquarters at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania," named in the said seventh paragraph of the said last will and testament of James Loughridge, deceased.

That neither of us have any interest in making this affidavit, except to establish the facts herein stated, and which are known to us of our personal knowledge to be true.
