State of Iowa, Madison County, ss. I, W.H.Vance, of said county and state, being first duly sworn on my oath do depose and say:

That I have been a resident of Madison County, Iowa, continuously, for more than 35 years last past. That I am well and personally acquainted with Enfield Whitenack, who was a daughter of Rebecca C.
