Iowa, and that I was well and personally acquainted with William Kehler and his family who on or about Sept. 28th 1854 purchased of Simpson Butcher the above described land, and continued to live thereon up to and until his death about the year 1858 or 59. That he died intestate leaving as his sole and only heirs- atlaw his widow, Julia A. Kehler and five children viz: Catharine Kehler, Sarah Kehler, William Kehler, Albert Kehler and Ira Kehler.
