That she is the widow of August Jackson late of the County of Pocahontas in the State of Iowa.

That the said August Jackson departed this life on or about the 4th day of September 1888 and left surviving him as his sole and only heirs at law, his widow this affiant, his daughter Alice Jackson, his daughter Anne May Jackson and his son William A. Jackson.

That he left no other children or descendants of a deceased child either lawfully born or adopted.

That this affiant as his widow, elected to take the provisions made for her under and by virtue of the terms of the last will and testament of the said August Jackson.
