State of California, County of Los Angeles, ss, Nancy G. Jack and Lillian V. Rate being first duly sworn on oath each for herself deposes and says that William Jack died at Creston, Iowa on July 6th, 1910, and prior to his death was the owner of the premises situated in the County of Madison and State of Iowa known and described as follows; to wit: "The West half of the Southwest quarter of Section 25 and the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 26, and the West half of the North east quarter of Section 35 all in Township 74, North of Range 26, and West of the 5th P.M."

That no administration was taken out of the estate of said William Jack, deceased. That immediately after the death of William Jack, deceased the family advertised in the public press that they would pay all debts due from the deceased, and that all debts of the deceased were paid by members of the family. That all debts of every description were paid, except a mortgage upon the premises above described for the sum of \$1000.00, and that these affiants verily believe that there is no other debt, claim or demand.

That these are all of the children born of the marriage between William Jack, Deceased and Nancy C. Jack, except a son M. I. Jack who was unmarried, and died at Douglas, Wyoming, on October 26th, 1910.

That the foregoing widow and children constitute all of the heirs of the deceased William Jack, and further affiant sayeth not.
