State of Iowa, Madison County. ss I, W.V. Clark, of said county and State, on oath say that I am a son of Joseph Clarke who died testate in Madison County, Iowa, owning the west half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the south west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section twenty two (22) in township seventy six (76) north, of range twenty eight (28) west of the 5th P.M., Iowa.

That Margaret Clarke, the widow of said Joseph Clarke, my mother, never remarried, and died intestate on or about the ____ day of October A.D. 1913; that she accepted the provisions of the will of my father Joseph Clarke, and that she used the said real estate during her entire life time, and received the rents and profits of the same.

That said Margaret Clarke left as her only children and heirs at law, Mary T. Cline, A. H. Clark, Anna Bell Clark, now Anna Bell Stull, Thomas A. Clark, David H. Clark, Wm. V. Clark, and Margaret I. Clark, now Margaret I. Tullis; that the children of Joseph Clarke all spell their last name Clark instead of Clarke.

That the estate of said Margaret Clarke has been fully settled, and all her debts including the expenses of her last sickness and funeral have been paid; that my brother David H. Clark never lived in Earlham, Iowa, or in Kacksburg, Iowa, and that he did not live or have his residence or domicile in Madison County, Iowa, during the years 1903 or 1904, and that the David Clark against whom unpaid personal taxes appear for those years on the tax books of Madison County, Iowa, was some David Clark other than my brother.
