Dunlap, of said County on oath depose and say that I have been acquainted with the ownership of the west half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the south west quarter (4) of section twenty two (22), in Township seventy six (76) north, of range twenty eight (28), west of the 5th P.M., Iowa, since in the year 1870; that I was acquainted with Thomas J. Kale who with his wife Kate or Catharine on or about April 9th, 1870, conveyed said real estate to Joseph Clarke; that Kate Kale or Catharine Kale, as the name appears in the deed of conveyance, was one and the same person, the wife of Thomas J. Kale, her correct name being Catharine, and she being commonly known as Kate. (
