State of Kansas, Decatur County, ss. I, Isaac Reager, of said County and State, formerly of Madison County, Iowa, on oath say that I am the man who entered and to whom was patented the south east quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the north west quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section seventeen (17) in township seventy four (74) north, of range twenty seven (27) west of the 5th P.M., Iowa; that I am the same Isaac Reager to afterwards sold the east half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of said forty acre tract to my father Andrew Reager; that my father Andrew Reager died intestate on or about the 23 day of April A. D. 1863, leaving surviving his widow Orpah Reager, and as his only children and heirs at law the following named persons; Prudence Reager, George W. Reager, Mary Reager, Leonard Reager, William Reager, Isaac Reager, and Joseph Reager; that Prudence Reager afterwards married one Matthew Cunningham, and that Mary Reager afterwards married one John King, and that the

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children and heirs at law of said Andrew Reager above named are the same and identical persons as the Prudence Cunningham, George W. Reager, Mary King, Leonard Reager, William C. Reager, Isaac Reager, and Joseph Reager, defendants in a proceeding for the partition of the real estate owned by said Andrew Reager at the time of his death; that Leonard Reager and Joseph Reager as the names are given in the return of the officer who served notice of said partition proceeding upon them are the Leonard Reager and Joseph Reager heirs of said Andrew Reager above named. That the children and heirs at law of said Andrew Reager afterwards sold said tract belonging to said Andrew Reager to one John W. Gregory, and are the persons who executed conveyances thereof to said John W. Gregory in the year 1866; that after I entered said land and the same was patented to me said land was continuously in the possession of myself or my father Andrew Reager until his death, when it remained in the possession of myself and of the heirs at law of my father until it was sold to John W. Gregory, and from the time it was sold to John W. Gregory it remained in his possession and under his control continuously for nearly forty years to my own knowledge, and that neither George S. Ruby, Jane Oakes, James Travis, Pernetia Travis or Pernelia Travis was ever in possession thereof, or owned or controlled any part thereof.
