Wight who is named as grantee in a certain deed dated March 3rd 1876 and recorded in Deed Record 16 page 384 and conveying the West Half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the North East Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the South West Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Fourteen (14), Township 75 North, Range, 29 West of the 5th P.M. and other land, the grantor in said deed being Theodore Wight. That Theodore L. Wight was a son of Theodore Wight. That Theodore L. Wight died intestate

about 6 or 7 years before Theodore Wight died having never been married. Theodore L. Wight was a brother of James M. Wight and George Wight who are named as heirs in the estate of Theodore Wight who died August 12th 1887.
