State of Iowa Warren County, SS. I. Frank C. Walker, being duly sworn on oath depose and say that I am a son of Cyrus Walker, now deceased, who died intestate in Madison County, Iowa, January 26th, 1915, seized in fee simple of Lots Eleven (11), and Twelve, (12), in Block One, (1), of Nicholson's Addition to Earlham, Iowa, and that I am credibly informed that the tax books of Madison County, Iowa show personal taxes assessed against F.C. Walker of 50 cents for the years 1892, 1893, 1894, 1896, 1897, 1898, 1900, 1901, 1902, and 1903. That my initials are F.C. but that I am not the same person as the said F.C. Walker, as I was only 8 years in 1892, and was only 19 years old in 1903, and never resided in Winterset, but did reside 16 miles from Winterset for the early years of my life, and was never subject to poll tax in said county. That I am informed that the tax books of said county show personal tax against one John Walker of Truro; that my brother John Walker was not the same person, and was only 14 years old in 1896, the year said tax is assessed and that he never lived in or near Truro and never was subject to assessment in Madison County. That I understand that there are taxes in the sum of \$24.32 against one J.E. Walker in Madison Township, said county, for the year 1903; that said J.E. Walker is a different person from any of my brothers, and I have no brother or relative by said name, and none of my brothers ever lived in Madison Township said county nor had any property subject to assessment therein. That I understand that there is a tax of fifty cents personal or poll tax on the tax book of Webster Township Madison County, Iowa against Theo. Walker, for the year 1898, and I depose and say that the said Theo Walker is not the same person as my brother Theodore Walker; that he removed from Madison County, Iowa, to Montana, in 1896 and that he was only 20 years old at that time, and did not return to said county, and never lived in Webster Township nor had he any property there, and was not subject to poll tax. I make this affidavit from personal knowledge.
