State of Iowa Madison County, SS. I, Benton Jones, of said County and State, on oath say that I was personally acquainted with Jonathan Low, who entered and to whom was patented the south east quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section thirty two (32), in township seventy four (74) north, of range twenty six (26), west of the Fifth P.M., I<sub>g</sub>wa; that at the time said Jonathan Low conveyed unto Mary Martha Low the west half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the said Southeast quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of said section, on or about July 1st, 1880, he was a single man, his wife, Mary Low, having died on or about the third day of March, A.D. 1880; that said grantee Mary Martha Low was the same and identical person as Mary H. Lowe who on or about December 31st, 1907, conveyed the southwest quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the southeast quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of said section to James Lowe; that said patentee Jonathan Low was the same and identical person as Jonathan Lowe who with his wife Mary on or about February 26, 1879, conveyed to William Low the east half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the southeast quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of said section; that said Jonathan Lowe died on or about the third day of September, A.D. 1893, his wife Mary having died on or about March 3rd, 1880, as before stated. That I knew all of the parties herein referred to, and the facts above stated are true as I believe.
