State of Washington County of Spokane SS:- I, J.W.Richards, of said State and County first being duly sworn upon my oath depose and say that I was well and personally acquainted with George W.Howe, and that to my personal knowledge the said George W.Howe, died intestate, October 1st A.D. 1864, leaving as his only heirs at law the following:- Martha S.Howe, his widow, Sukey Howe, his mother, Sumner Howe, Joseph J.Howe, Eliza J.Williams, Charles Howe, and Martha W.Cowles his brothers and sisters, and that to my personal knowledge the said Sukey Howe, Sumner Howe and Joseph J.Howe were each unmarried on June 25th, 1866, at which time the mother, brothers and sisters conveyed to the said widow of the said George W.Howe the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  22-74-27 and other lands, and that the estate of the said George W.Howe has long since been fully settled and all debts and claims have been paid in full.
