State of Iowa Madison County SS;- I.W.W.Crawford of said County and State, on oath say that I was acquainted with Samuel Dorrance who died in Madison County, Iowa, in the year 1860, owning the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section thirty three (33) in township seventy six (76) north, of range twenty six (26), west of the Fifth P.M., Iowa; that I am a son of Oliver Crawford who was interested with said Samuel Dorrance in the ownership of said land; that said Samuel Dorrance died intestate; that he left surviving as his widow Mary Dorrance, and as his only heirs at law his children James H. Dorrance, William Dorrance, and Martha J. Dorrance, who afterwards married one Samuel White; that said Mary Dorrance did not remarry, and died intestate many years ago leaving surviving as her only heirs at law her children, the above named James H. Dorrance, William Dorrance, and Martha J. White, and that they are the same and identical persons as the James H. Dorrance or James H. Dorrance William Dorrance or William Dorrance, and Martha J. White who on or about September 30th 1902 executed a quit claim deed conveying said real estate to William E. Garmon, under his initials W.E. Garmon. That I was personally acquainted with John Shreves one of the grantees in a conveyance of said real estate from John C. Culbertson and wife dated October 1, 1853, and that he was the same and identical man as John Shreaves who on or about May 4th, 1855, executed a quit claim deed of said land to my father Oliver Crawford, in which the name of the grantee is spelled Crofford.

That I was personally acquainted with Alexander Pattison, the grantee in a conveyance of the north half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of said section, township, and range, dated January 19th, 1870, and that he was the same and identical man as Alex Patterson who on or about July 22nd, 1875, conveyed fourteen acres off the east end of the last described tract to Abner Bell.

That I am a son of Oliver Crawford or as the name is sometimes spelled Oliver Crofford who died owning the south half of the forty acre tract above described, and that in the settlement of his estate the name Crawford is sometimes spelled Crofford, but that the names Crawford and Crofford refer to the same persons; that R.J. Crawford and R.J. Crofford is the same person; that M.T. Crawford and M.T. Crofford is the same person; that W.W. Crawford and W.W. Crofford is the same person; that C.S. Crawford and C.S. Crofford is the same person. That I have lived for over sixty years in the immediate vicinity of said land, and have known all of the persons above named, and the facts stated are true as I believe.
