State of Iowa, Polk County, SS. I, Richard Homann, being duly sworn, depose and say that I am the son of Mrs. F. M. Meisker, and a brother of Albert C. Homann; Oscar C. Homann; Katherine Sylvester; Eleanor Homann; Emily Homann; and Caroline Page, who departed this life in Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa, on or about the 9th day of December, 1913.

That this affiant, Richard Homan, and Conrad Albert Homan, Oscar C. Homan, Ella Nora Homan, Caroline Homan and Amelia Homan and Matilda K. Homan, who derived by the Will of Ocke Friedrichsen, title of the following described real estate; the west fractional half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the northeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the east fractional half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Three, Township Seventy Seven, Range Twenty Nine, West of the Fifth P. M. Iowa are the same and identical persons named in and made a party in a certain partion proceedings commenced in the district court of Madison County, Iowa, on the 26th day of January, 1898; and are the same and identical persons made parties in a certain action brought by Albert C. Homann, Trustee, in the district court of Madison County, Iowa, on the 27th day of October, 1917, for authority to sell the real estate hereinbefore described and to convert the trust estate.

That Matilda K. Homann, subsequent to said partian proceedings became the wife of J. B. Peyton, and she was thereafter known by the name of Katherine Peyton, and that thereafter she obtained a divorce from her said husband, J. B. Peyton, and subsequently married John Sylvester, and is now known as Katherine Sylvester.

That Caroline Homann, devisee under said Will, subsequent to the probating of said will married Lon R. Page and was thereafter known as Caroline Page, and that on or about the 9th day of December, 1912, the said Caroline Page died, leaving surviving her Lon R. Page her husband and two children, Eugene R. Page and Frederick L. Page, both minors.

That Mrs. Friederick M. Meisker was the daughter of Ocke Friedrichsen who died testate in Madison County, Iowa, on or about the 1st day of September, 1896, and by whose Will she was given a life estate in the real estate described in this affidavit; that the said Mrs. Meisker has been described and named in various proceedings and documents pertaining to said real estate as Mrs. Friederick M. Meisker, Mrs. F. M. Meisker and Mrs. F. M. Homann, all of which names pertain to the same and identical person.

The deponent further states that Oscar Homann whose name appears as grantee in a deed of conveyance from Richard Homann and wife, dated November 29, 1915, and filed for record January 11, 1917 there appears to be a typographical error in that the name therein is written as Ocsar when it should have been written Oscar and that the said Ocsar and Oscar C. Homann are one and the identical person.
