I, J.S. Hermon, being first duly sworn, on my oath depose and say that I am a son of Elizabeth Hircock, who conveyed the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ & SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 19-75-27 and other land, to me ^{by} deed dated November 20th 1889 and recorded in Deed Record 27, page 503, and to whom myself and wife, Mary Jane Hermon, executed a certain mortgage on said land, dated October 26th 1897 and recorded in Mortgage Record 34, page 338, my name being through error spelled Hermon in the record of above named deed and mortgage. That the said Elizabeth Hircock died intestate and a widow in Madison County, Iowa, about January 6th 1900, leaving surviving her as her sole and only children and heirs at law this affiant, intermarried with Mary Jane Hermon, or M. J. Hermon, Emma Reese, intermarried with Robert Reese, E. A. Hermon, Hannah Beall, intermarried with Edward Beall, Jm. Hircock, intermarried with Hannah Hircock, Francis A. Emerson, intermarried with Henry Emerson, B. F. Hermon, intermarried with Mary Hermon, and Ellen Comer, intermarried with William Comer; and that the above named heirs of said Elizabeth Hircock, except this affiant and wife are the same persons respectively who executed release of the above described mortgage said releases being filed for record on February 16th 1900 and recorded in Miscellaneous Record 14, pages 152, 153, 154 and 155. That the estate of the said Elizabeth Hircock was settled without administration and all claims paid in full.
