List of lands in the DISTRICT OF LANDS subject to sale at Chariton now Fort Des Moines, Outside of the Six, and within the fifteen miles limit, of the Reserve to satisfy the grant made to the State of Iowa by the Act of Congress, approved May 15th, 1856, entitled, "An Act making a grant of lands to the State of Iowa in alternate Sections, to aid in the Construction of Certain Railroads in said State, "being the lands selected by the Agent of the Governor of the State of Iowa from the lands of the United States, in alternate Sections and parts of Sections, designated by odd numbers nearest to the tier of sections within Six Sections in width on each side of the Rail-road, "from Burlington on the Mississippi River to a point on the Missouri River near the mouth of the Platte River", and in lieu of the lands in alternate Sections designated by odd numbers within said six sections in width, which the United States had legally, "sold or otherwise appropriated, or to which the rights of Pre-emption have attached."

Wilson, Acting COMMISSIONER OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE, do hereby certify that the foregoing on pages one to fourteen inclusive, is a true and correct list of the tracts of land selected by the Agent of the State of Iowa, OUTSIDE OF THE SIX, AND WITHIN THE FIFTEEN MILE LIMITS, under the Act of Congress approved May, 15th, 1856, entitled, "An Act making a grant of lands to the State of Iowa in alternate sections to aid in the Construction of Certain Rail Roads in said State," the said selections being from the lands of the United States, in the alternate sections desig-

nated by odd numbers, most contiguous to the tier of sections within six sections in width on each side of the Rail Roads "from Burlington on the Mississippi River to a point on the Missouri River near the mouth of the Platte River," and known as, the "Burlington and Missouri River Rail Road," in the District of the lands subject to a sale at Chariton, now fort Des Moines, and being in lieu of the lands in the alternate sections designated by odd numbers within said six sections in width on each side of said road, which the United States had legally sold, or to which the right of Pre-emption had legally attached prior to the period at which the rights of the State inured under said grant; and they now submitted for the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, in accordance with the requirements of said Act, May 15th, 1856, subject to all its conditions, and to any valid interfering rights which may exist to any of the tracts embraced in the foregoing List.
